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
Budget Priorities:

- Goals:

- Supports to meet these Goals:

- Genesis Student information system that teachers will utilize to access curriculum, develop lesson plans, and log and report out assessment information to parents
- Ongoing professional development focused on the connection between these domains

6th-8th Grade Science

- Goal:

- To better support instruction and assessment of the Next Generation
 Science Standards
- Supports to meet the Goal:
 - Investigation of science programs that were developed for the Next Generation Science Standards and also have strong technology components
 - Example: Amplify Science
 - Ongoing professional development around new science assessment methods

Technology Curriculum and Integration

- Goals:

- Build upon the integration of technological skills already being fostered in the 3rd-8th grade classrooms with improved tools
- Ensure that the technology curriculum moves students forward in line with 21st century competencies

- Supports to meet these Goals:

- iPad carts in the technology classroom
- Professional Development ongoing support for the management of iPads and integration of technology into the classroom
- Curriculum revisions/rewriting to integrate the new "Learn to Code" Swift classes
