

WELCOME TO THE CAST OF “Frozen Jr.”

Congratulations! You had the courage to take a risk and audition and were selected for the cast of “Frozen Jr.” This alone is an incredible achievement and you should be proud of yourself. Green Brook Middle School is lucky to have many talented students and the competition was tough. Please remember that every person in this production is important and crucial to the success of the show. With this in mind, please read the following and acknowledge agreement with your signature and a signature from a parent/guardian.

The musical is an extra-curricular activity and as such, subject to the same expectations applied to other extra-curricular activities. Expectations include:

- **Attendance** as scheduled
- Maintenance of **good academic standing**, and
- **Appropriate conduct** during rehearsals and within the school day.

This is a demanding commitment and students must be willing to make participation their **first priority**. I recognize that many students have multiple commitments outside of school and I suggest that if you have extensive obligations that take priority, you should forego your participation in the musical. Students unable to meet the demands of the rehearsal schedule will be replaced in the cast at the discretion of the director.

It is expected that you will maintain your current academic standing. This requires special attention to time-management skills. I anticipate that all students will come to rehearsals prepared with homework to accomplish during the down time (which there will be plenty of). Teachers will be asked to carefully monitor student progress during this time and communicate concerns in a timely manner. If participation in the musical jeopardizes your academic success, you will be replaced in the cast.

Cooperative, appropriate behavior is expected at all times in school, including extra-curricular activities. A successful production is dependant upon the cooperation and attention of the cast. Time-restraints make it impossible for the director(s) to waste valuable rehearsal time monitoring and addressing disruptive student behavior. To be a successful cast member, you must demonstrate maturity, self-control, and respect for yourself, other students, and the staff. Students unable to meet these behavioral expectations will be replaced at the director’s discretion.

Once again, I congratulate you for your courage and willingness to be a part of this production. This will be an incredible experience for all involved. I look forward to the excitement and fun this show will generate. Your hard work will reap many benefits that you will remember for the rest of your life.

General Information

All information will be updated on the musical page (<http://www.gbtps.org/clubs-and-activities/spring-musical/>).

Some things to consider:

- In general, lead roles will rehearse 3-5 times a week, ensemble roles will rehearse 1-5 times a week. Attendance at rehearsal is **mandatory** unless the student was absent from school. Rehearsals run from 3pm to 5pm generally, but some days will go longer or shorter depending on the needs of the actors
 - Please **check your schedules** so you can let Mr. Alzaher know of any conflicts right away.
 - Students may be part of the cast **or** the crew, not both
 - Tech week starts March 24th. There's a dress rehearsal on the 26th and performances on 3/27 and 3/28
 - Each student will need to **buy their own costume(s)** for the show according to the descriptions Mr. Alzaher provides. There will also be a \$20 fee to pay for cast shirts and the cast party which is on 3/28

Rehearsal Rules

Firstly, there are a **lot** of people in this cast and crew. That means everyone needs to be responsible for their own behavior. We only have 2-3 months to put this show together, so every minute of every rehearsal is priceless. With your hard work and attentiveness, this will be an amazing production

When you arrive at rehearsal, do so quickly and quietly. Each rehearsal will be prefaced with an agenda and general timeline of events. Please read the following expectations carefully so you know what is expected of you regarding behavior and attitude during rehearsals. Failure to abide by rehearsal rules may result in dismissal from the cast or crew at the director's discretion.

1. When you are not on stage working on a scene you must remain seated and quiet. Cast members are encouraged to sit, watch, and listen to their peers rehearse so they can better understand the plot and how to improve their own performance.
2. There will be a lot of down time during rehearsals. **Bring homework** and a book to every rehearsal to keep you occupied when you're not rehearsing.
3. Cell phones must be turned off and put away during rehearsal. You may use them during breaks only.
4. Do not wander off. We need to be able to quickly find you when it is time to run your scene. When you are called, come immediately.
5. If you need to use the bathroom or restroom, make sure you let a parent or staff member know before you leave.
6. There will be times where students will be asked to work on their scenes with other staff members or parents. If/when this is the case, treat those teachers/parents with respect by being well-behaved, prepared, and taking your role(s) seriously.
7. There will be a short break during each rehearsal where students can eat a quick snack. Do not eat in the auditorium and please clean up after yourself.
8. Articulate, enunciate, act expressively, and enjoy your scenes on stage. Don't act, **become your character**.
9. This is *your* show. Do *everything* you can to **make it a success**.
10. Thanks for your cooperation! This year's show is going to be incredible!
